CHAMP LIBRE ANNOUNCES ITS 7th INTERNATIONAL BIENNALE THAT WILL TAKE PLACE ON THE SITE OF THE GRANDE BIBLIOTHÈQUE IN MONTREAL IN THE FALL OF 2006.

A UNIQUE EVENT IN MONTREAL BETWEEN ARCHITECTURE AND NEW MEDIA

Champ Libre is proud to announce the 7th MANIFESTATION INTERNATIONALE VIDÉO ET ART ÉLECTRONIQUE, MONTRÉAL (MIVAEM) that will take place from September 20th till the 1st of October 2006 under the theme: Cité invisible/Invisible City. At the time of this biennale event of great scope at the meeting point between architecture and new media, the site of the GRANDE BIBLIOTHÈQUE, new place of knowledge and culture (inauguration April 2005) will be invested and staged in order to propose a interdisciplinary programming and a multimedia in situ presentation touching the domains of video, electronic arts, architecture and urban planning.

The stagecraft of this artistic event has been entrusted to the Montreal architecture workshop: IN SITU founded by the architects STÉPHANE PRATTE AND ANNIE LEBEL, winners of the Rome Grand Prize in Architecture of the Canada Council for the Arts (2002). Champ Libre will present equally at the time of its 7th biennale an important international symposium on architecture and numerical arts in partnership with the Montreal contemporary art magazine PARACHUTE.

Many national and international curators are already working to the artistic programming, and several artists have begun the creation of original in situ artworks for the 7th Manifestation of Champ Libre. Besides, a big part of the programming will be selected from the international call for projects that is launched today on the Champ Libre Website and that will be a witness of the contemporary vitality of the international artistic and architectural creation in these avant-garde domains related to new technologies.

Let us remind that Champ Libre has attracted close to 11 000 visitors to the des Carrières Incinerator, an imposing Montreal industrial structure that had been abandoned for 10 years, to live an unforgettable artistic, urban and architectural experience.
